



During this academic year 46 research papers were published in National/International journals or in ISBN Books and 01 book is also published. 27 Research Papers were presented in National/International Conferences/Seminars. 02 Research Scholars obtained their Ph.D. from the research centres of our college. 01 teacher was sanctioned six months leave to attend coursework for their Pre-research course. 03 Teachers participated in Orientation Programmes/Refresher Courses/Summer/Winter School. 19 teachers were Research Guides in the college.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

Induction of more number of computers extension of Internet Access Services in various Departments and Office are in progress. The improved computer services such as the complete automation of catalogues and the improved internet facilities for all the users in the library and in many departments are also in progress. ICT is being used for teaching in various departments such as in the Department of Teacher Education and in most of the Science Departments. Various College Committees are formed to ensure the upgradation of infrastructural services. The construction of a new Maths Department and enlargement of Teacher Education Department are also in progress.
