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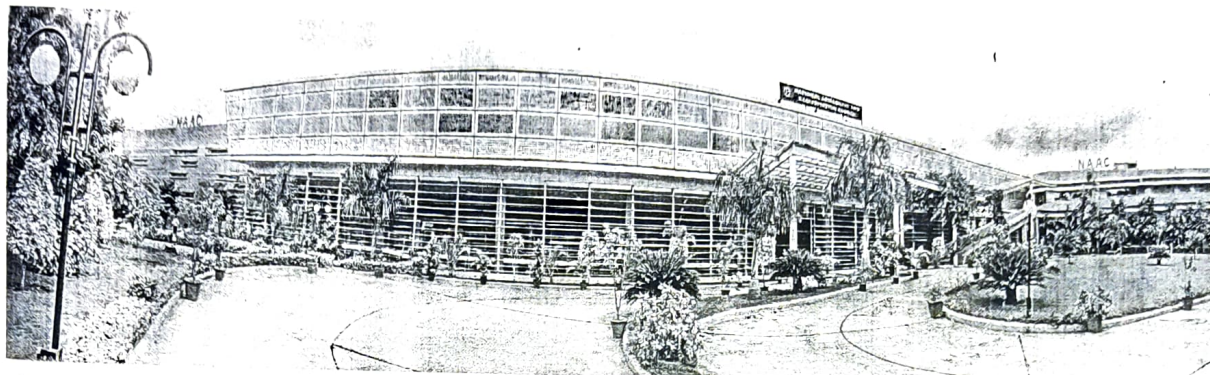

Induction of more number of computers extension of Internet Access Services in various Departments and Office are in progress. The improved computer services such as the complete automation of catalogues and the improved internet facilities for all the users in the library and in many departments are also in progress. 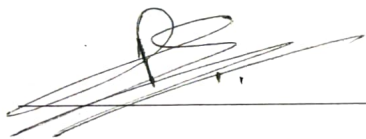
